






Locations

These EU funded postdoctoral fellowships provide opportunities to acquire and transfer new knowledge and to work on Research & Innovation in a European country or outside Europe. 

Being a Postdoc





A postdoc is generally a **temporary position**. A PhD can extend their **research training** in a postdoctoral job, gaining knowledge and experience that will help them in their academic career.

A postdoc primarily undertakes research positions as **part of a bigger research team** and works on a predetermined project or one of their own under the **supervision of a PI**. Postdocs are also expected to **develop their independence**, so they commonly take on more senior roles including teaching, grant writing, and mentoring.

Postdoc positions have **no set length** and may be **available for two to three years** but can be extended depending on multiple factors e.g., grants & funding, university, PI etc. Be aware that in Germany there is a law about length of <u>scientific working contracts</u>.

Funding for postdocs may be obtained **in multiple ways**. They can work as salaried employees of a research institute, university, or companies. Alternatively, postdocs may receive a stipend via a scholarship, fellowship, or grant.




TUM Sustainability Office

The TUM Compliance Office (TUM CO) is responsible for the <u>TUM Codes of Conduct</u>, which offer principles regarding fundraising activities, collaborations with partners from industry and academia, Faculty Recruitment, the <u>Bylaw of Good Scientific Practice and Procedures in Cases of Academic Misconduct (TUM-SGwP)</u>, and the <u>TUM Respect Guide</u> as a commitment to a respectful university culture.

- All members and partners of the university can reach out to the TUM CO in case of a potential violation of the applicable regulations and standards
- The TUM CO operates independently and neutrally according to formal procedures
- All information issued to the TUM CO is treated with strict confidentiality in order to protect the informant and the persons affected by allegations
- In case of a potential academic misconduct, the Ombudspersons examine the complaints and introduce formal Ombudsverfahren if applicable
- The Ombudsperson TV-L gives advice on clarifying conflicts in reference to freedom of academia and conscience






